WHAT IS COTUTELLE

'Cotutelle' students have their doctoral studies not only supervised jointly by academics from an Australian University and a French University, but if successful, the student will be awarded a joint or double-badged doctoral degree by the two institutions, stating that the award was made as a consequence of a Cotutelle agreement with the partner institutions.

Cotutelle is possible in all French universities, under French national regulations. The ANU has signed the Cotutelle agreement with France to enable our students to take advantage of this opportunity.
