In the wake of the historic power-sharing agreement between Sinn Fein and the Democratic Unionist Party, the National Europe Centre and the Friends of Ireland Society Inc., invite you to hear from the British and Irish governments on the prospects for peace in Northern Ireland under the newly-elected Stormont assembly. The British High Commissioner, the Rt Hon Helen Liddell and the Ambassador for Ireland Mr **Máirtín Ó Fainín**, will discuss issues connected with the devolution and peace processes and their likely effects on the future of Northern Ireland.

**The Rt Hon Helen Liddell** has had a distinguished career as a member of parliament in the House of Commons and was a member of Cabinet from 2001 to 2003. She commenced her appointment as High Commissioner to Australia in July 2005.

**Ambassador Máirtín Ó Fainín's** professional experience includes posts in the Anglo-Irish Political Division of the Irish Department of Foreign Affairs, and as Secretary to the British-Irish Parliamentary Body. His current posting as Ambassador for Ireland to Australia commenced in October 2006.
