

COMMONWEALTH SUPPORTED PLACES (MASTERS BY COURSEWORK)

Don't miss out on a Commonwealth Supported Place!

What is a Commonwealth Supported Place?

A Commonwealth-supported place can save more than 60 per cent on the cost of full-fee graduate study. With a Commonwealth-supported place, you will pay the equivalent of undergraduate fees for your graduate coursework. If you have a strong academic record you may no longer need to pay up to \$2,100 per subject for a graduate degree, as subjects in our Commonwealth-supported programs in 2009 cost around \$650 each. Plus if you pay your fees upfront, you will receive an additional 20 per cent discount.

Commonwealth Supported Places are limited in number and selection is highly competitive. Not all applicants will be successful. Commonwealth-supported place fees are only applicable to the following programs offered by the ANU College of Asia & the Pacific (Faculty of Asian Studies):

- Master of Arts (Asia-Pacific Studies)
- Master of Asia-Pacific Studies

Who is eligible?

Australian citizens and permanent resident students who are eligible for HECS are eligible to apply. Commonwealth-supported places are available to those who are accepted into either of the Masters by coursework programs.

Non-award study (ie non-degree enrolment) is not eligible.

How are students selected?

The Selection Committee will select students on the basis of past academic performance.

Applications

Applying for a Commonwealth-supported place is a two step process:

1. Submit an application for the Master of Arts (Asia-Pacific Studies) or the Master of Asia-Pacific Studies through the University Admissions Centre by 13 February 2009.
2. If accepted, submit an application for a Commonwealth-supported place.
