Within the format of the Japanese meditation/bath stool, this class introduces students to the fundamentals of mortise and tenon joinery and encourages them to explore ideas around proportion and detail.

This project based course covers the practical aspects of, setting out joinery, the correct use of the hand plane, paring chisel, tenon saw and includes, the preparation and finishing of wood.

Consideration will be given to the structural aspects of joining wood, as a design parameter including the ergonomic requirements of a simple wooden stool.

This course is recommended for beginning to intermediate students.
