

PUBLIC INTEREST FACTORS

Remission of Fees – based on the OAIC guidelines PART 4 (4.55)

<u>Public Debate</u> - the document(s) relate to a matter of public debate or policy issue under discussion within the ANU and disclosure of the document(s) would assist public comment or participation in the debate/discussion.

<u>Agency Decision</u> - the document(s) relate to an ANU decision that has been a topic of public interest or discussion and release of the document would better inform the public on how or why the decision was made.

Published Research - the document(s) is to be used by a researcher in research that is to be widely published or that complements research being undertaken in an agency or elsewhere in the research community.

Parliamentary submissions - the document(s) is to be used by a community or non-profit organisation in preparing a submission to a parliamentary or government inquiry. Examples include, law reform, social justice, civil liberties, environmental protection issues etc.

<u>Member of Parliament</u> - the document(s) is to be used by a Member of Parliament in a parliamentary or public debate on an issue of public interest or general interest in the member's electorate.

<u>Journalist</u> - the document(s) is to be used by a journalist preparing a story for publication that is likely to be of general public interest (different to gossip)

NOTE: Public Interest is a large concept and whilst these are the main factors considered they are not necessarily the only factors considered. If you believe your request falls within Public Interest but does not fit into one of these categories provide a statement indicating how and why you believe your request falls within the scope of Public Interest.
