Dates, Links and Deadlines

Due Dates

Semester One for Commonwealth Supported Contributions, Domestic Tuition Fees (DTF) and International Student Fees (ISF) is the **13 March 2009**.

Semester Two for Commonwealth Supported Contributions, Domestic Tuition Fees (DTF) and International Student Fees (ISF) is the **7 August 2009**.

Summer, autumn, winter and spring session due dates will appear on the invoice, usually 3 weeks from the date the invoice is issued. (Note that some Colleges may require summer sessions to be paid before the due date so please contact your college)

Census Dates 2009

- . Semester One **Tuesday** the **31 March 2009**
- . Semester Two **Monday** the **31 August 2009**

Census date for non-standard sessions may be different for each course in the session. Students need to be aware of when each census date is for each course. These can be found at:

This is especially important for Students who wish to drop their course, as they need to do this before the census date in order to avoid any financial penalties.

The same applies to students wishing to use **FEE HELP**. The request must be completed electronically in ISIS (eCAF) on or before the census date of the first course in the session, if not the student will be liable for the fees.

Commonwealth Supported students are required to complete the **HECS HELP** request form electronically in ISIS (eCAF) at the time of enrolment. If a staff member was to enrol a student, the student must be advised to complete the checklist in ISIS, which includes the HECS HELP form. This must be completed no later than the census date.

New Zealand Citizens (not NZ permanent residents) and Australian Permanent Residents are eligible for a Commonwealth supported place and use up their Student Learning Entitlement (SLE) but they must pay their contribution up front (not allowed to defer) without a discount. This must be paid by the due date of the fees.

Humanitarian Permanent resident visa holders are eligible for a Commonwealth Supported place and eligible for HECS HELP as long as they have not yet met the requirements to become an Australian citizen.
