

THE AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL UNIVERSITY
ANU HONOURS SCHOLARSHIP
CONDITIONS OF AWARD

1. INTRODUCTION

There shall be a number of scholarships for award each year which shall be known as the ANU Honours Scholarships.

2. VALUE

Each scholarship shall be valued at not less than \$5,000, paid in two equal instalments at the beginning of each semester.

3. ELIGIBILITY

A person shall be eligible to apply who is an Australian citizen, holds Permanent Residence Status in Australia or is an international student and either:

- (a) is currently enrolled or has been enrolled at this University or another university in a program of study leading to the award of a degree of Bachelor; or
- (b) is currently enrolled or has been enrolled at this University or another university in a combined program leading to two degrees, one of which will lead to the award of the degree of Bachelor with honours.

4. APPLICATION AND SELECTION

Applications shall be called for with a closing date as set, from time to time, by the University Awards Committee. The application shall be submitted on the prescribed electronic form. An applicant who is not currently a student of this University must apply separately and concurrently for admission to the University.

The Committee shall determine, in any year, whether academic references shall be requested.

The Chair of the University Awards Committee approves the award of the Scholarships.

The Committee shall allocate the scholarships across Colleges on the basis of information available to the Committee at the time. Recommendations for selection, in any year, may take into consideration the distribution of awards among internal and external applicants as well as among the honours schools in a particular College. Recommendations may also take into account the fields of study in which the candidates have expressed an interest, the reports of two academic referees and the availability of appropriate supervision as certified by the relevant Dean and other aspects as specified by the University Awards Committee from time to time.

A scholarship shall not be awarded if, in the opinion of the Chair of the University Awards Committee, there is no applicant of sufficient merit.

5. CONCURRENT HOLDING OF SCHOLARSHIPS

Subject to the approval of the University Awards Committee an ANU Honours Scholar may hold, concurrently with an ANU Honours Scholarship, other scholarships and awards except for those listed below.

Approval for concurrent holding will not be granted to students who hold another ANU administered scholarship which has been awarded specifically for Honours, ANU National Undergraduate Scholars, ANU Region Scholars, ANU National Achievement Scholars, Bachelor of Philosophy Scholars or to holders of any scholarship offered within the University which is equivalent to or greater in value than an ANU National Undergraduate Scholarship.

6. ENROLMENT

Except with the permission of the University Awards Committee, the successful applicant shall enrol and remain enrolled on a full-time basis at this University in either the Honours Year of a program of study leading to the award of the degree of Bachelor with Honours or in the final year of a program of study leading to the award of the degree of Bachelor with Honours where the honours component is an integral part of the final year.

7. COMMENCEMENT

With the approval of the relevant Dean of the College, a successful applicant may commence the Honours Program in either first or second semester of the academic year.

8. TENURE

The scholarships are for one year, payable from the date on which the course is taken up in Canberra. Scholarship instalments will be made at the beginning of each semester of the Honours year.

9. TERMINATION

The scholarship may be terminated where a successful applicant:

- (a) fails to enrol for the Honours Year of a program of study leading to the award of the degree of Bachelor with Honours within one year of the award of the scholarship;
- (b) changes to part-time enrolment without the permission of the University Awards Committee;
- (c) withdraws from the program before completing the year;
- (d) has not, in the opinion of the University Awards Committee, acting on the advice of the relevant Dean, performed at a satisfactory academic level in the first semester of the Honours Program.

Should the scholarship be terminated the University Awards Committee, acting, if necessary, on the advice of the Dean of the relevant ANU College, shall determine if any or all of the scholarship monies should be repaid.



10. PUBLICITY

It is anticipated that ANU Honours Scholars may be requested to participate in publicity of the Scholarships from time to time. This may include publicity in the state or territory of residence or of schooling. Scholars may be contacted for an interview and photograph. The University may also publicise the Scholarships by publishing the names of the scholars. Arrangements for such publicity will be made through the Marketing and Communications Division of the University.
