

THE AUSTRALIAN NATIONAL UNIVERSITY
ANU LEARNING FOR LIFE STUDENTS SCHOLARSHIPS
CONDITIONS of AWARD

1. Introduction

The ANU Learning for Life Students Scholarships have been introduced by The Australian National University as part of its partnership with The Smith Family to enhance the financial support of undergraduate students enrolled at Australian National University who are supported by The Smith Family's Learning for Life program. The scholarships may be used for any purpose to assist students during their enrolment at the Australian National University.

2. Value

The value of each scholarship shall be set out in the letter of offer and may vary, but will not be less than \$2,000 a year for each full-time year of undergraduate study. The scholarship shall be paid in equal instalments after the census date of each semester.

The Scholarships do not provide exemption from payment of tuition fees.

3. Eligibility

An Applicant must be:

(a) an Australian citizen, an Australian permanent resident or hold an Australian permanent humanitarian visa;

(b) supported by The Smith Family's Learning for Life program;

(c) enrolled as a full-time student in an undergraduate degree program at the Australian National University, which may include Honours.

4. Application

There is no formal application process for this scholarship. The Smith Family will provide a list of Learning for Life students they support who are enrolled at The Australian National University. After confirming the students' enrolment, the University will provide an offer letter to all eligible students, along with the conditions of award.

5. Concurrent holding of scholarships

Scholars may hold other scholarships, bursaries or awards concurrently with an ANU Learning for Life Students Scholarship.

6. Program Withdrawal & Repayment of Scholarship

In the event that a scholar withdraws during a semester of their degree program after receiving their scholarship payment for that semester, the Chair of the University Awards Committee shall determine if any or all of the scholarship monies should be repaid.

7. Termination

The scholarship shall terminate on the date on which the scholar ceases to attend the University other than for approved absences or if the scholar ceases to be supported by the Learning for Life program, whichever is the earlier. The University may terminate the scholarship before this time if the scholar does not fulfil his or her obligations or if, in the opinion of the Chair of the University Awards

Committee, acting on the advice of the Director Student Equity, satisfactory academic progress is not being made by the scholar.

8. Publicity

ANU Learning for Life Students Scholarship holders may be requested from time to time to participate in publicity for the scholarship. This may include publicity in the state or territory of residence or of schooling. Scholars may be contacted for an interview and photograph. The University may also publicise the scholarships by publishing the names of the scholars. Arrangements for such publicity will be made through the Communications and External Liaison Office of the University.

9. Obligations of Scholars

Recipients will be expected to assist with promoting The Australian National University's partnership with The Smith Family from time to time, including participation in joint activities between the Australian National University and The Smith Family to enhance higher education opportunities for Learning for Life students.

10. Taxation Implications

It is the Scholar's responsibility to determine the taxation implications of the award, if any, which apply to their individual circumstances.

11. Employment

The award does not carry any commitment by the University for future employment.
