



CHRIS AND KERRY MARKS TRAVEL GRANT

CONDITIONS OF AWARD

1. INTRODUCTION

Each year the ANU College of Law may offer a number of awards known as the Chris and Kerryn Marks Travel Grant ("the award").

The objective of this award is to support ANU College of Law students undertaking an internship with the Kimberley Community Legal Services (KCLS) with the costs of visiting the Kimberley in Western Australia, for the purpose of spending time with the KCLS staff and the community they serve. It is anticipated that this travel will increase opportunity for ANU students, regardless of their financial means, and further enrich their student experience, cultural competence and learning outcomes as they develop a greater understanding of justice and the legal system, as it impacts on Aboriginal peoples in the Kimberley.

Funding for this award has been provided by Chris and Kerryn Marks.

2. BENEFITS

The value of the award is stated in your letter of offer. The award is paid in a single instalment upon the submission of the final approved travel application for the internship, unless otherwise stated in the letter of offer.

The recipient is responsible for making payment of all tuition fees by the prescribed date as set out by the University each session. Recipients of this award are responsible for the costs of books, study materials, accommodation and all other costs of study.

3. ELIGIBILITY

The award is available each year to a current ANU student who:

- (a) Has applied and intends to undertake an internship in the Kimberley with the Kimberley Community Legal Service.
- (b) is an Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen, holder of an Australian Permanent Resident visa or a permanent humanitarian visa; and
- (c) is enrolled in a Bachelor of Laws (Honours) (LLB(Hons)) or Juris Doctor (JD) in the ANU College of Law; and
- (d) is maintaining a credit average or above in their LLB(Hons) or JD.

4. APPLICATION

There is no separate scholarship application as students are automatically considered based on them meeting the eligibility criteria and applying for a Kimberley Community Legal Service (KCLS) internship by the deadline published on the ANU scholarship website.

5. SELECTION

Selection is made on the basis of information provided in the application form to undertake an internship with the Kimberley Community Legal Service on the following criteria.

- demonstrated commitment to understanding and pursuing Indigenous justice;
- demonstrated commitment to developing Indigenous Cultural Competency (applicable to non-Indigenous students);
- interest in and understanding of the goals of the Kimberley Community Legal Service;
- relevant past experience and skills (including any barriers faced that prevented a student getting that experience); and
- relational skills or aptitudes such as empathy and compassion.

Additional factors may be taken into account such as Indigenous status and academic achievement.

The award is offered by a selection committee chaired by the Director of Clinical Courses and Internships in the ANU College of Law.

The selection committee reserves the right to make no award if it considers there is no applicant of sufficient merit. The selection committee may also vary the number of awards if multiple winners are identified by splitting the award.

6. CONCURRENT HOLDING OF AWARDS

A recipient of the scholarship is not permitted to concurrently hold other scholarships, awards, grants and bursaries.

7. DEFERMENT

The award cannot be deferred.

8. ONGOING ELIGIBILITY

A recipient of this award is required to remain enrolled in the internship course specified in section 3(a).

9. CESSATION OF AWARD

The award ceases or should be surrendered:

- (a) if a student no longer meets the eligibility or ongoing eligibility requirements
- (b) if a recipient breaches academic or behavioural standards set by the University under the Academic Misconduct & Discipline Rules;

whichever is earliest.

10. REPAYMENT OF FUNDS

Subject to the information available at the time, the Selection Committee may request that the payment for the semester in which the breach of conditions or withdrawal occurs be refunded in part or in full.

11. PROVIDING FALSE OR MISLEADING INFORMATION

The awarding of a scholarship/grant is based on the information provided to the University. An award may be withdrawn at any stage if incorrect, false or misleading information is provided or relevant information is withheld. This includes circumstances where the false information is unrelated to the assessment in awarding the scholarship/grant.

12. VARIATION TO CONDITIONS OF AWARD

In exceptional circumstances and on a case-by-case basis section 7 of these conditions of award may be varied by the Dean on the recommendation of the Chair of Selection Committee, and in consultation with ANU Advancement and the donor.

13. TAXATION & CENTRELINK

Recipients are responsible for seeking taxation and Centrelink advice regarding their own individual circumstances. Scholarships/grants may be regarded as taxable income if a recipient is enrolled on a part-time basis.

14. PUBLICITY

The recipient may be requested to participate in publicity for the award from time to time. This may include publicity in the state or territory of residence or of schooling. Recipients may be contacted for an interview and photograph. The University may also publicise the award by publishing the names of the recipients. Arrangements for such publicity will be made through ANU College of Law or Strategic Communications and Public Affairs Office of the University.

15. DISCLOSURE AND DONOR CONTACT

For the purposes of reporting on the impact of scholarships, the name, program name and demographics (for example: age, country or town of residence) relating to a recipient of this award may be disclosed to donors supporting the award. This will not include recipient contact details. The recipient may be given the opportunity to write a letter of thanks, or to meet with donors, if both the donor and student provide their consent. Any contact between a donor and a recipient will be facilitated by the ANU Advancement Office or an authorised representative of the University.
