



2022 National Indigenous Summer School

The Tjabal Indigenous Higher Education Centre and the ANU Colleges will host a Summer School for Indigenous students currently in years 10 and 11 who have an interest in university studies.

This week-long Summer School will run from 3rd – 10th December 2022, to provide learning experiences to help inform education and career aspirations and goals. Students will participate in a program of hands-on activities from a range of discipline fields on the theme of 'Our World – Our Future'.

Expert academic staff, Indigenous university students and staff will mentor participants through a fun-filled program in the nation's capital, which promises rewarding experiences on and off campus. The Tjabal Centre and ANU Colleges cover all accommodation, transport, catering and workshop materials.

There are two streams running in the Summer School with 15 places in each: the Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics and Medicine (STEMM) stream and the Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences (HASS) stream. You can only select one Summer School stream to attend; examples of subjects covered in the two streams are detailed in the table.
