PARKINSON'S ACT GEORGE WEBB MEMORIAL AWARD
CONDITIONS OF AWARD

1. INTRODUCTION AND RECOGNITION

Each year the ANU Medical School may offer an award known as the Parkinson's ACT George Webb Memorial Award.

The objective of the award is to advance the clinical skill in Parkinson's Disease of an ANU Medical School student.

The value of the current value of the award is \$2000. (The value of the award was \$1,200 from 2013 to 2016). The award will be on offer from 2013 until 2025.

Funding for this prize has been provided by Parkinson's ACT Inc. In 2017, the award was renamed to honour the late Dr George Webb who was instrumental in setting up the award.

2. ELIGIBILITY

The award is available each year to an ANU student who:

- (a) is a domestic or international student
- (b) is enrolled in Year Three of the Doctor of Medicine and Surgery Program
- (c) agrees to take up an elective placement related to Parkinson's Disease and will provide an acceptance letter from an elective centre with the application
- (d) provides a 100 word statement on why they believe they should be the recipient of the award.

3. SELECTION AND CONSTRAINTS

A selection committee, including the ANU Medical School Dean and members from the Academic Unit of neurology at the ANU Medical School, will decide the recipient of the award based on the eligibility criteria.

The selection committee will ensure Parkinson's ACT Inc. is advised of the award recipient and of his/her elective placement.

The selection committee reserves the right to make no award if it considers there is no applicant of sufficient merit, based on the eligibility criteria.

If the successful student is subsequently unwilling or unable to take up the elective placement at the approved Centre the money shall be repaid in full.

4. RECIPIENT OBLIGATIONS

The awarding of an award is based on the information provided to the University. An award may be declined by the recipient once they have been notified as the prize winner. This must be provided in writing to the ANU Medical School Dean no later than one month from notification.

If the prize is accepted by the recipient, they agree to the Publication of their name.

In order to develop and maintain a relationship between Parkinson's ACT Inc. and the recipient, the recipient agrees to:

- (a) Write a short article (no more than three pages) for publication in one of the monthly Parkinson's ACT Inc. Bulletins; and
- (b) Attend and present (no more than 15 minutes) to one of the Parkinson's ACT Inc. regular support group meetings.

5. REVIEW OF PRIZE

The award will be reviewed:

- (a) at the conclusion of the period outlined in section 1; or
 - (b) if any eligibility requirements are to be amended
 - (c) after 3 years
- whichever is earliest.

6. VARIATION TO CONDITIONS OF AWARD

In exceptional circumstances and on a case-by-case basis, these conditions of award may be varied by the Dean of the ANU Medical School on the recommendation of the Chair of the selection committee.
