JOHN BUCKINGHAM RESEARCH PROJECT PRIZE

Conditions of Award

- 1. There shall be a prize to the value of \$700 and a plaque or certificate, for award each year which shall be known as the John Buckingham Research Project Prize.
- 2. The prize shall be awarded to the student who, in that year:
 - (i) was enrolled in Year Three of the Doctor of Medicine and Surgery (MChD)/Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) Program in the ANU College of Medicine, Biology and Environment;
 - (ii) was awarded a Higher Level Performance (HLP) grade for MEDI2003 (Medical School Research Project) when initially submitted; and
 - (iii) received the highest number of HLP marks out of the total possible marks from both the supervisor and examiner's scoring rubrics.
- 3. The Selection Committee Chaired by the Deputy Dean shall review the qualifying research project submissions and recommend to the Dean of Medicine and Health Sciences a winner.
- 4. If there were a tie this would be broken by the student who received the most HLP marks from the examiner however the Committee may recommend the prize be shared
- 5. If, in any year, no student is assessed by the Dean of Medicine and Health Sciences, acting on the advice of the Selection Committee as sufficiently outstanding, the prize shall not be awarded in that year.
