ORACLE (POLICY AUTOMATION) PRIZE IN COMPUTER STUDIES

Conditions of Award

1. There shall be a prize of \$350 for award each year which shall be known as the Oracle (Policy Automation) Prize in Computer Studies.
2. The prize shall be awarded each year to the student who achieves the best aggregate results in any four of the following courses:

COMP3900 Human Computer Interface Design and Evaluation; or
COMP3610 Principles of Programming Languages;
COMP3320 High Performance Scientific Computation
COMP3420 Data Warehousing and Data Mining
COMP3600 Algorithms
COMP3620 Artificial Intelligence
COMP3630 Theory of Computation
COMP4300 Parallel Systems
3. If any of the nominated courses cease to be offered, it may be replaced by another course offered by the ANU College of Engineering and Computer Science, the content of which is similar to the content of the previously offered course.
4. The full set of courses for which the prize is awarded need not to have been taken in the same year. At least one course, however, must have been taken in the year of the award of the prize.
5. In determining a student's eligibility for the prize, the student's result in a particular course shall not be considered if:
 - (i). the student was not enrolled in that course for the first time; or
 - (ii). in the opinion of the Dean of the ANU College of Engineering and Computer Science, that course's content is substantially similar to that of any other unit, course, or subject undertaken either at the University or any other tertiary education institution.
6. If, in any year, two or more students equally merit the award of the prize, the prize money in that year shall be divided equally between them.
7. If, in any year, no student achieves results that, in the opinion of the Dean, justify awarding the prize in that year, the prize shall not be awarded in that year.
