**STEPHEN WURM GRADUATE PRIZE FOR PACIFIC LINGUISTIC
STUDIES**

Conditions of Award

1. There shall be a prize of \$1,000 for award each year which shall be known as the Stephen Wurm Graduate Prize for Pacific Linguistic Studies.
2. The prize shall be awarded each year to the student who:
 - (i) was enrolled in the College of Asia and the Pacific;
 - (ii) was admitted to the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in the previous calendar year; and
 - (iii) in the opinion of the Prize Assessment Panel, submitted the best thesis on a topic that was substantially based on outstanding field research in the linguistics of the Pacific/Asia region.
3. The Assessment Panel shall be appointed annually by the Dean and Director of the ANU College of Asia and the Pacific, shall number at least three members and shall comprise senior staff in Linguistics from across the University.
4. Nominations shall be called for, by the Dean and Director of the ANU College of Asia and the Pacific, once each year, usually in March.
5. The Assessment Panel may take into account the comments of the examiners and the supervisors of the thesis.
6. If, in any year, two or more students are judged to be of equal merit, the prize awarded in that year shall be divided equally between them.
7. If, in any year, no student achieves results that, in the opinion of the Dean and Director of the ANU College of Asia and the Pacific, justify awarding the prize in that year, the prize shall not be awarded in that year.
