

**CITATION – Professor Frank Jackson, ANU College of Arts & Social Sciences**

The Peter Baume Award is the University's most prestigious award. It recognises eminent achievement and merit of the highest order.

Widely regarded as one of the most important living philosophers, Professor Frank Jackson has done ground-breaking work in the philosophy of mind, philosophy of language, and philosophical methodology. His article, "Epiphenomenal Qualia", in which he presented his famous "knowledge argument" against materialism, is one of the most cited papers in philosophy. It appears centrally in David Lodge's novel *Thinks...* as does Jackson himself. He has received numerous accolades, including the Order of Australia, being elected Fellow of the Australian Academy of Humanities, Fellow of the Academy of the Social Sciences in Australia, and Corresponding Fellow of the British Academy, being the John Locke Lecturer at Oxford, and was chosen as a 'Citation Laureate' by Thomson-ISI. He served as the Director of the Institute of Advanced Studies (1998-2001), Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research) (2001), and Director of the Research School of Social Sciences (2004-2007).
